COVID-19

The Village Hall is currently closed to the public until further notice due to COVID-19 concerns. Use the drop box located north of the front door if you have something to drop off. It is recommended to everyone to practice social distancing.

The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.

The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.

- Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
- Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.
- These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Put distance between yourself and other people. This is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, **use a** hand sanitizer that contains at least 60%

alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.

- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

LARGE TRASH PICKUP

Town-wide large trash pick-up has been delayed at this time due to COVID-19. We will let you know when a new date is scheduled.

If you have a large trash item that needs to get picked up and it's not during a large trash pick-up time, you may call Republic Services, personally, and request/schedule the pickup. The number to call is: (618) 656-6883, Option 3, and Option 3 again. You may also reach them at: <u>www.republicservices.com</u> and schedule/request a large trash pick-up.

We know that a lot of the residents are doing extra spring cleaning due to the COVID-19 situation. A dumpster is located at the City Shed that is picked up (emptied) three (3) times a week. A full dumpster means "come back and try again." If materials are dumped alongside or overfill the container... that's not good -illegal as a matter of fact- so please don't do that. If the lid does not close, it is too full! There are cameras fixed on the dumpsters and abusers will be identified and invited to come get their treasures and pay a fine (starting at \$100).

GRASS CUTTING/YARD WASTE/DUMP

It's grass cutting time! Please do not blow your clippings into the street as it clogs up the sewer systems and if it rains, it gets very slick on the roads for cycles. Please cut the grass and blow it back into your own yards.

Please do not leave trash, limbs, and other debris piling up on your property.

You can bring yard waste (leaves, grass, bushes, plants) out to the dump east of the park. DO NOT put leaves and grass on the burn pile! They go east of the burn pile. There are signs posted where everything is to be put.

PHONE NUMBERS/CONTACT INFO

We have been trying to update everyone's phone numbers in our water billing system and have found that there are still old phone numbers listed. We tried making calls for a Public Hearing recently and there were several residences with outdated information. Please call us to confirm your numbers and/or email information.

WATER BILLS ----- REMINDER

Payments on water bills are due by the 25th of each month. If your bills aren't paid by that date, a late fee will be assessed.

If you drop off your water bills (drop box) you do not need an envelope if you're paying by check – we will match up the stub and check. If paying by cash, please put it in an envelope.

We are no longer making phone calls to residents to remind them of past due invoices. Letters will still be sent stating the cutoff/shutoff dates. To ensure that you do not get shut off, please submit your payment on time.

DO NOT TURN YOUR WATER ON YOURSELF, YOU WILL BE SUBJECT TO FINES. A Village worker will be back to turn it on after the reconnect fee has been paid.

WALKING/DOG WALKING

The weather is getting nicer --- and more folks are out walking. Please be observant and keep an eye out for them. For the walkers that walk at night --please get a reflective vest so drivers can see you! Also --- please walk on the correct side of the road (facing traffic). Please use the sidewalks where available.

For those of you who walk your dogs, please take along a plastic bag and clean up. There are many residents that have complained about feces in their yards and it's not from their dog (and sometimes/most times they don't even have one). **PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PET!**

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Mark Taylor, Aviston's Chief of Police has retired after 20 years, effective April 3, 2020. If you see him, tell him 'Congratulations!' Thank you, Mark, for your service! Kyle Markus is interim Chief. Due to the nicer weather, it has been noticed that there are more people using their ATV's/UTV's/4wheelers/ORV's (no matter what size). Remember: you must be **18** to drive an ORV on Village streets. Also, these vehicles are not to be driven on sidewalks. You must also have a permit.

ORV STICKERS

If you have a sticker which you purchased last year, you are still legal through December 31, 2020. If you recently purchased an ORV, you will need a sticker to legally drive it on village streets. Cost is \$35 per permit and good through the end of the year. Renewals will be required effective 1/1/21.

AVISTON PARK

The Aviston Park has closed some of its facilities (pavilions, bathrooms and playgrounds) due to the COVID-19 outbreak. What is NOT CLOSED is the walking path. With nice days coming, please keep in mind when walking and please keep your distance! The Park also asks that when walking your pets to start your walk in a counter-clockwise direction when starting on First Street to Schumacher Road. Hopefully, this will keep pets from visiting to maintain the social distancing requirement. There will be signs for the closure and directional walking along the path soon. As always, stay safe and keep your Park clean. Thank You!

CENSUS 2020

The 2020 Census is now underway. Notifications have been sent to households throughout the state and country. Census Day was on Wednesday, April 1. It is the day that everyone should use as the reference when filling out the Census. Where a resident life on April 1 is the basis for how they should fill out their 2020 Census.

If you have not already, it is encouraged for all residents to fill out their 2020 Census form. That can be done online, via phone or via mail. More information is available in the information you received from the Census Bureau.

More information about responding to the census is available at 2020Census.gov.

If you have a PO Box, you will not receive a Census form, so you HAVE TO go on-line to fill out the paperwork.

Federal funding determined by the 2020 Census will support Head Start programs, nutrition services, Medicaid, and other services for children and families. Since the census is conducted only every 10 years, missing one child means missing out on federal funding for that child for the next 10 years!
