VILLAGE NEWS:

The 2019 Consolidated Election is scheduled for April 2, 2019. Petitions for the elected office may be circulated starting September 18, 2018. The filing period for the election is December 10-17, 2018. Each candidate has a petition signature requirement of 6-56. If you would like to run for office (Aviston will have 3 Trustee positions Open), you must first file a Statement of Economic Interest with the County Clerk's Office. Upon filing that, you will receive a 'receipt' which would need to be turned into the Village Hall so Village Staff can file the certificate of ballot at the Courthouse. If you have any questions, please contact the Village Hall.

WATER BILLS

Payments on water bills are due by the 25th of each month. If your bills aren't paid by that date, a late fee will be assessed.

AVISTON PARK DISTRICT

The Aviston Park Board has begun a park bench program to place benches for seating around the walking path. These benches can be purchased as a memorial for a loved one, a donation from an entire family, or just a way to help brighten up our community's park.
