Many of the residents have gotten rid of their LAN lines and only use cell phones --- the Village cannot get in touch with you if we do not have good contact number(s). If you have changed phone numbers within the last 5(?) years, please call us to ensure that we have good contact numbers. If you're not sure, call us anyway.

When cutting grass, please do not blow the grass into the streets. This can clog up the sewer systems and if it rains, it gets very slick on the roads for cycles. Please cut the grass and blow it back into your own yards.

The Village of Aviston shut off policy for all water customers has been changed a slight bit. If your water is shut off due to non-payment, your service will be reconnected the next business day AFTER payment is made. Please do NOT expect to have your water service restored immediately after payment is made.

The Vintage Hall is available for rent for any Aviston resident. The fees for this for 2019 are \$50 rental fee with a \$100 deposit. As of January 1, 2020, the rental fee will be increased to \$75 and the deposit amount will remain unchanged. When renting the building, please keep in mind that you are in a residential area and that outside entertainment (music, etc.) must be kept to a minimum so residents are not disrupted.

Due to the Off-Road Vehicle (ORV) ordinance being in effect, the Aviston Police Department will now be issuing tickets to those that do not have the permit stickers displayed. Also remember ---- you must be 18 to drive a UTV on Village streets. These vehicles are not to be driven on sidewalks.
