WATER DISCOLORATION

Do you have dirty water? Do you have a water softener? These two may be related. It has been found that the people that have been having trouble with their water are also those that have water softeners. It seems to happen when the cycles are run on the softeners. Please follow the manufacturer guidelines for cleaning your softeners. Actually, CLEAN your appliance. (i.e. take out all salt, clean injector ports). There is a special iron removal salt available for helping remove iron which people have been using and having luck with. This may prevent the problems you're having.
