(For those who have already reserved a date (and not paid) for 2020, you will be getting a phone call for these fees). If the reservation is canceled, the Village will keep the rental fee. When renting the building, please keep in mind that you are in a residential area and that outside entertainment (music, etc.) must be kept to a minimum so residents are not disrupted.

Please have all trash ready for pick-up by 6 a.m. on Monday mornings (Tuesday if there's a holiday). Do not put trash in recycle containers --- it will not be picked up.
