We ask that you mark where your meter is with a flag (workers will drop off a flag at each residence) Once you put your flag in the yard, please do not remove it. The workers will remove it once your new meter is in place.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

<u>REMINDER:</u> Per Village Ordinance # 14-5-2.21

The **owners of residential or commercial property** situated within the corporate limits of the Village of Aviston **are hereby required to post, print, paint or otherwise affix the address or street number of said property on at least one building or major structure located thereon**. Said address or street number is to be posted, printed, painted or affixed in such a way as to be easily visible from the closest thoroughfare or roadway that may pass in what would be considered the front of said building or structure. In the cases where numbers are not visible from the roadway, numbers should also be posted at the mailbox, or other such structure so as to be plainly visible.

This is also a requirement of the Clinton County 9-1-1 system so all emergency vehicles can find your home. **This was to have been accomplished by June 1, 2021.** If you haven't accomplished it, the police officers will be making courtesy visits to ensure that the numbers get placed.

Please obey all traffic signs. We are still getting complaints about speeding on side roads as well as running stop signs.

Please do NOT blow grass out into the curb or street. It is illegal to do so. This is not only a Village ordinance violation but against State law.

As always, if you see anything out of place or suspicious, please call for help and our officers will check it out.

HYDRANT FLUSHING

Village-wide hydrant flushing is scheduled for **June 21st-25^{th.}** Please be cautious when doing your laundry because there may be discoloration.

STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping will be on Wednesday, June 23rd. Page and Clinton streets are the main ones being done at this time and we ask that you remove your vehicles from those streets that morning. Work should be accomplished by noon.

GRASS CUTTING/YARD WASTE/DUMP

It's grass cutting time! Please do not blow your clippings into the street, in the curbing or on the sidewalks as it clogs up the sewer systems and if it rains, it gets very slick on the roads for cycles. Please cut the grass and blow it back into your own yards.

Please do not leave trash, limbs, and other debris piling up on your property.

You can bring yard waste (leaves, grass, bushes, plants) out to the dump east of the park. DO NOT put leaves and grass on the burn pile! They go east of the burn pile. There are signs posted where everything is to be put.

SWIMMING POOLS

Summer is here --- if you are planning on having a swimming pool, remember: every swimming pool that is more than two (2) feet deep shall be enclosed by a wall or fence at least 3 ¹/₂ ft. or 42 inches in height. The fence must be a rigid type fence. The passage through such wall or fence shall be equipped with a gate.

ACH DEBIT

(Authorization Agreement for Direct Payments): The Village is offering a one-time \$10 credit on your Village utility bill for new sign-ups to have your account auto-deducted (ACH) every month.

NEW/ADDITIONAL DROP BOX

For your convenience, a new/additional drop box has been added on the south side of the Village Hall in the alley. You don't need to get out of your vehicle to drop off any correspondence.

When using the new drop box and you continue down the alley, please be courteous and mindful of the people that live along the alley ---- no speeding!!

OFF ROAD VEHICLE (ORV) STICKERS

2021 ORV stickers are available for purchase. This is for renewals or if you recently purchased an ORV. You will need a sticker to legally drive it on village streets. The forms are available online and we appreciate it if you would provide a copy of your driver's license and a current insurance card at the time of submission. Cost is \$35 per permit and good through December 31, 2021.

WALKING/DOG WALKING/HORSES

As always, remember to watch out for walkers. Please be observant and keep an eye out for them. For the walkers that walk at night --- please get a reflective vest so drivers can see you! Also --please walk on the correct side of the road (facing traffic). Please use the sidewalks where available.

For those of you who walk your dogs, please take along a plastic bag and clean up. There are many residents that have complained about feces in their yards and it's not from their dog (and sometimes/most times they don't even have one).

Also, if you have a horse and ride around the community, please clean up after them on the roads. It is not the responsibility of the police or residents to clean up the droppings.
