#### WATER METERS

- The majority of the water meters have been replaced. Hopefully, for the ones that haven't been replaced, we hope that your flag is still in place.

#### **DO NOT REMOVE IT!**

- When your meter has been replaced, the workers will remove. If you have already removed it yourself, please put it back or if you have thrown it away, please call us and we will get you another one or you may pick up another flag at the Village Hall.

- When your meter is being replaced, you will notice an interruption in your water service and possibly dark water when it first starts coming out again.

- The workers that are replacing the meters are in a silver Dodge pickup truck. Please do not bother them and ask questions when they are working.

- Please note that after your meter has been replaced and you receive your first bill, you may notice your bill is higher than before. The new meters are more precise and provide more accurate, real-time readings, meaning the moment water is being used, the meter is capturing usage. The old meters were slower to respond to immediate water usage, resulting in less accurate/precise readings.
