TRASH & RECYCLE

Please know the difference between garbage and recycling!

Recycle: Boxes and tissue paper, gift bags (uncoated and unembellished), wrapping paper (if plain and uncoated), clean plastic bottles, most clean plastic to-go cups & lids, aluminum beverage cans, clean paper containers, clean plastic food containers.

<u>Trash:</u> bows, ribbons, cellophane, gift bags (if coated or embellished), wrapping paper (if glossy or embellished), polystyrene foam cups & containers, used napkins or food containers, plastic utensils & straws, paper cups, plastic bags.

All residents that require an additional trash tote will be charged \$6/month per container above the standard 1 per household.

If you want your old trash bin removed, you must: Call Republic Services (618)656-6883 to schedule a Bulk removal, put a note on the trash bin to notify the driver, call by Wednesday to be removed on the next trash day.
